# neighborhood revitalization

#### every neighborhood thrives when empowered

Residents of a community know their hopes and dreams for their neighborhood – safe streets with decent and affordable homes, a place to buy healthy food, a park for the kids to play, a school where students thrive. Through our neighborhood revitalization work, we partner with residents, community leaders and organizations to address real concerns and improve the lives of the people who live in the neighborhood.

This year marked our fifth year anniversary working with the residents of the Haiti Street neighborhood.

In June, after months of being unable to plan events due to COVID-19, resident leaders of Haiti Street planned and hosted a barbecue with the Warrenton Police department.

The cookout helped foster relationships and deeper understanding between the officers and residents of the neighborhood. Over 40 neighborhood residents attended the barbecue.

In an effort ensure Fauquier Habitat homes remain affordable, we partnered with Northern Virginia Habitat and Habitat Virginia to create and launch the Virginia Statewide Community Land Trust. Under the Community Land Trust Model, homes remain affordable in perpetuity using two key strategies: using ground leases that promote shared equity, and targeting eligible individuals and families living at 30% to

80% of annual median income (AMI). These strategies allow homeowners to purchase a home at an affordable price, earn equity with their purchase, and possess the same rights of survivorship. In exchange for the opportunity to purchase an affordable home, a CLT homeowner agrees to pass on the benefit by selling the home at an affordable price to someone who meets the same eligibility requirements. Fauquier Habitat's ReStore accepts donations and sells a constantly changing inventory of diverse, high-quality merchandise to the public at a fraction of the retail price, while diverting reusable household items and building materials from area landfills. Sales of donated items help us partner with local families to build, rehabilitate and repair safe and affordable homes.

In May 2021, the ReStore started hosting monthly workshops: *Redo it at the ReStore: A beginner's chalk paint class* and *Don't Be Shocked: A beginner's electrical class*. In each workshop, members of the community learn new skills in a fun environment while also supporting Fauquier Habitat's work.

In 2019 & 2020, a small but passionate team of dreamers – comprised of volunteers, donors, and staff – recommitted Fauquier Habitat for Humanity to lean into the core of its mission: ensuring that our neighbors have access to safe, decent, and affordable homes in Fauquier and Rappahannock Counties. 
